

Beech Village Show, September 25, 2021

Beech Gardeners are delighted to announce that the popular Beech Village Show will be back in 2021, Covid restrictions permitting. Please support the Show by entering as many classes as you can and dropping by to view the exhibits. You may be surprised at the hidden talents of your friends and neighbours!

We aim to cover the cost of staging the show with entry fees (30p per entry per class), a modest profit on refreshments and a plant stall. If we do not cover the cost, we will not be able to put on a show next year.

There will be something for everybody at this year's show, with 43 classes covering flowers, vegetables, fruit, cookery, crafts, photography, painting and poetry.

Families are welcome

Children may enter any class; age on entry envelope please. If we have sufficient children's entries in a class, we will subdivide it. Where the class is not subdivided, the judges will take age into account— though in practice they haven't needed to.

The Family class of Making a Troll is for everyone of all ages in the family to join in.

Prizes

Two classes—Abstract Art and Poetry—will be judged by public vote at the show.

A cup is awarded to the Gardening Club member accruing the most points in the show, and there is a Brownie Point Cup for the person entering the most classes. We have awards for various categories and certificates for all classes.

Cake Fest

This year, to support Beech's proposed Coffee & Cake Shop, there will be a CAKE FEST, a stall with delicious cakes for sale, and an extra special show class for a plate of coffee morning goodies of the competitor's choice.

How to enter

Each entry costs 30p per Class.

You may enter as many classes as you wish but only one entry per class per person.

Please enter with one envelope per person containing the entry fees for all the classes you are entering. Each person entering must submit the envelope for themselves.

On the outside of the envelope please write: total cash enclosed, Name, Address, Contact Details in case of query, the actual number/s of the Class(es) you wish to enter, the total number of Classes entered, and for children, their age.

Entry envelopes to be submitted by Monday September 20 to Sue Robinson, 49 Medstead Road, or Kathy Pearce, Woodlawn, 104 Medstead Road.

Exhibit instructions

Please bring your exhibits to the Village Hall between 9am and 10am on Saturday September 25.

If you are unable to be present on the day, you can give your protectively wrapped entry to Kathy at Woodlawn beforehand with the entry envelope.

Where possible, exhibitors should name varieties of produce to assist the judges, and in class 20 please provide the name of the Fairy Tale.

Your name should not be visible on the exhibit, but supplied on a piece of card face down on the display table prior to judging.

Fresh food items (Classes 25 to 27) should be covered with clear film or presented in a clear plastic bag.

Fruit and vegetable entries to be on a plain white plate.

Please do not remove your exhibits before 1.30pm to allow the public to view.

Judging

Judging will take place between 10am and 12noon and the Show will be open to the public at 12noon.

Results of the public votes on classes 41 and 42 will be announced at 1.15pm.
